# Cisco Unified Communications Manager Unified Serviceability CSRF Vulnerability

### Cisco Security Vulnerability Policy

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### Summary

A vulnerability in the Cisco Unified Serviceability component of Cisco Unified Communications Manager (CUCM) could allow an unauthenticated, remote attacker to perform a cross-site request forgery (CSRF) attack.

The vulnerability is due to insufficient CSRF protections. An attacker could exploit this vulnerability by convincing an authenticated CUCM user to click a malicious link. An exploit could allow the attacker to perform actions within the Cisco Unified Serviceability pages with the privileges of the authenticated CUCM user.

Cisco has confirmed this vulnerability in a security notice; however, software updates are not available.

To exploit the vulnerability, the attacker may provide a link to a malicious site and may persuade the user to follow the link by using misleading language and instructions.

### Affected Products

#### Vulnerable Products

At the time this alert was first published, CUCM versions 9.1(1) and prior were vulnerable. Later versions of CUCM may also be affected.

#### Products Confirmed Not Vulnerable

No other Cisco products are currently known to be affected by these vulnerabilities.

### Workarounds

Administrators are advised to contact the vendor regarding future updates and releases.

Users are advised not to open email messages from suspicious or unrecognized sources. If users cannot verify that links or attachments included in email messages are safe, they are advised not to open them.

Administrators are advised to monitor affected systems.
